Attendance Rewards and Excursions

As we head towards the end of term, we're excited to announce several reward excursions linked to attendance. In Term 4, classrooms will have the opportunity to compete for special excursions based on the number of students maintaining regular attendance of over 90%. The classrooms with the highest regular attendance will earn a unique outing as a reward for their commitment. Additionally, students who maintain an average attendance of 90% or higher will be invited to attend our end-of-term reward excursion. For those achieving 98% attendance or higher, there will be an exclusive reward event in the last week of term. We need to improve our attendance as a community, as it is currently below where it needs to be. Too often, children tell us they were allowed to stay home when it wasn't necessary. Regular attendance is essential for academic success, and we're asking for your support to ensure your children are at school every day unless they are genuinely unwell. Let's work together to make attendance a priority and celebrate those who are consistently showing up ready to learn!



<u> Attendance – The First Reward</u>

To reward our students for their dedication and commitment to learning, we're excited to offer a special incentive at our upcoming *Book Fair*. Any student who achieves perfect attendance for the first nineteen days leading up to the Staff Development Day will receive a \$20 credit to spend at the *Book Fair*. For those who miss no more than one day during this period, earning an attendance rate of 94.5% or higher, we will provide a \$10 credit. You don't get both, it's either \$20 for 100% attendance of \$10 for 94.5% attendance. This is a fantastic opportunity for students to be recognised for their positive attendance and to enjoy the benefits of their hard work. At Greenfields, we believe in celebrating our students' efforts and supporting their love of reading. Let's aim for outstanding attendance and enjoy a rewarding Book Fair experience together!

If your child doesn't get a voucher, that's okay. They'll have other opportunities to enjoy a reward for positive attendance as everyone's attendance will reset at the end of Week 4 (Thursday, 31 October 2024), so as many students as possible have an opportunity to celebrate their attendance in the final week of school.


DEADLY LOOLINGA NARRATIVE ART EXHIBITION
